## Second Reading - A reading from a Conference of St Vincent de Paul

Let us love God, sisters and brothers, let us love God, but let it be with the strength of our arms and the sweat of our brows; for very often many acts of love of God....although very good and desirable, are, nevertheless, very suspect if they don't translate into the practice of effective love. "By this," says Our Lord, "is my Father glorified, that you may bear much fruit." We have to be very careful about that; for there are many who,....filled with lofty sentiments of God...., stop at that, and when it comes to the point of doing something, and they have the opportunity to act, they come up short. ....Let's not fool ourselves: *Totum opus nostrum in operatione consistit* (that is, all our works consist in action). This is so true that the holy Apostle declares to us that only our works accompany us into the other life. ....The Church is compared to a great harvest that requires workers, but hardworking ones. .... That's what we should do, that's how we should witness to God by our works that we love Him.

## Gospel - Luke 4:16-20

Then Jesus went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath he went as usual to the synagogue. He stood up to read the Scriptures and was handed the book of the prophet Isaiah. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it is written, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has

chosen me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to set free the oppressed and announce that the time has come when the Lord will save his people." Jesus rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. All the people in the synagogue had their eyes fixed on him.

Vincent, father of the destitute the poor of Sion I will satisfy with bread, its priests I will clothe with salvation.


